

DEAR MUSIC STUDENT:

This year marks the 61st Season of the Red Lodge Music Festival. If you have just finished the seventh grade, are just graduating from high school, or are somewhere in between, you may attend the 61st Annual Red Lodge Music Festival. When you come to Red Lodge June 6 - 14 you will experience a unique blend of music performance and fun!

With the backdrop of the stunning Beartooth Mountains, you will be involved in musical performances in chamber music and larger groups such as wind ensembles, jazz ensembles, and orchestras. Your teachers will be talented performers from universities, colleges, and symphony orchestras from across the nation. They are selected for their ability to share their musical skills which you will hear in five evening recitals. Year after year, students leave the Festival praising the faculty.

These professional musicians will work with you in master classes and coach you as you prepare for performances in small ensembles, full orchestra, and wind ensembles. The director of Orchestras will be Luis Millán, orchestra director at the University of Montana. Peter Haberman, Concordia College, Minnesota, will conduct the bands. Greg Gatien of Brandon University and Scott Jeppesen of Montana State University Billings will conduct the jazz bands.

Something very special happens as the week progresses and you get together with students and faculty to make music. You will make friends with students and faculty from Montana and other states and develop greater skills in music performance. Your nine days at the Red Lodge Festival will be an experience you will cherish as a happy memory.

If you want to learn to play great music from professional musicians while staying in a scenic wonderland just an hour from Yellowstone Park, come to Red Lodge Music Festival this summer. Come to Music in the Mountains!

Students must have completed seventh grade with two years playing experience recommended and not have attended college at time of application.

FESTIVAL AUDITIONS

All students audition for ensemble and orchestra placement when they arrive at the Festival on Saturday, June 6, 2026. Audition materials for all instruments will be posted on the internet in the Spring of 2026 at **www.rlmf.org.**
